

1. Production Outturn

i) Overall Production:

During FY 2022-23 BLW has manufactured 315 locomotives till Feb'2023. This includes 312 electric, 2 NRC and 1 export locos:



 BLW could manage to produce only 283 WAG9 Locomotives against proportionate figure of 375 Locos till January'22, creating a shortfall of 92 Locos to meet Target of 450 Locos in FY2022-23. Short supply of main critical materials is the reason of less production vis-à-vis monthly target. Status of critical items supply is tabulated below:

From the above, it is clear that supply of the Propulsion system is the main constraint in achieving the target and Propulsion systems is still an area of concern. Even for production in Feb'23, only 29 Propulsions could be managed till 24th Feb. However As on date 30 locos are ready in all respect wheel up on bogie waiting for Propulsion System.





- **Jig/Fixtures dispatched to Z.Rlys/PUs:** Apart from full-filling in-house requirements, Jigs/Fixtures manufactured and dispatched to Z.Rlys/PUs in current FY of ₹35.68 lakh.
- Modification in Engine test bed no. 2: Air exhaust and Inlet duct of engine test bed no. 2 has been modified and commissioned as per drawing No. M1756M1239 to fulfill requirement of newly developed high efficiency ABB make Turbo super charger TPS-52 by in-house facilities.
- Reduction in AMC Expenditure: Service Engineering division had already taken action in previous financial year for reduction in AMCs, which resulted a reduction of AMC expenditure by 2.77% in year 2022-23 over year 2021-22 (till Jan).



All 37 Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE) as per latest European Norms /Indian Standards specifications are made **100%** available and being used.








5. Environment Management

A) Development of Alternative Sources of Energy (Solar Power):

- i) BLW has a total of 3.859 MWp Roof top Grid connected Solar installed capacity.
- ii) Renewable (Solar) energy generation in FY 2022-23 is **7.2% HIGHER** over corresponding period of previous year (Apr-Jan).



- iii) The **percentage share** of solar energy over the total energy consumption is **20.57%** (Apr-22 to Jan-23)
- 4. The saving on account of enhanced solar energy generation in year 2022-23 (up to Jan-23) is ₹1.92 crore in comparison to same period of year 2021-22 which was ₹1.07 crore.



B) GreenCo Rating:

DLW obtained GreenCo Silver Rating under the GreenCo Green Company Rating System and became the first production unit on IR having this certification.

BLW is in the process of obtaining Re-Certification.

BLW has surpassed the target set by Railway Board for 2022-23 in Jan'23 itself.

D) Rain water harvesting, Water recycling, Water conservation and management:

i) Rain Water Harvesting:

Approx. 44000 sqm roof top area of has been covered under RWH.

- One pond of 31000 KL capacity has been created to sort out the issue of water logging in Kanchanpur colony during rainy season. Apart from this, it will also ensure recharge of Ground water. Stone pitching has also been done around the pond.
- o 50 deep recharge wells in colony
- 8 nos. water bodies connected to storm water drains
- 5 abandoned tube wells converted into recharge wells





ii) Water recycling

- 1342 Million Liter water is recycled during 2022-23 till Jan'2023 by STP.
- Recycled water is used for irrigation of road side lawns, bungalows lawn/ garden, filling of water bodies at Surya Sarovar, Tagore Park and Golf course.



iii) Water conservation & management:

Motorised Gate valve have been provided along with automation of Pumps.

E) Effluent treatment pollution control and waste management:

- Industrial Effluent Treatment Plant (IETP) for treating contaminated & mixed Petroleum oil and Lubricants (POL) of 3 MLD capacity.
- Approx. 30 litres of oil and grease is separated during FY 2022-23.

- **Sewage Treatment Plant (STP):** For treatment of discharged human waste of 12 MLD (Million Litres per day) capacity. In STP approx. 4.47 million litres of water is being recycled every day.
- The treated water is released for agricultural and gardening purposes.
- The digested bio-manure as sludge dried is used as fertilizer for horticultural purpose.
- One water recycling plant commissioned at 'Surya Sarovar' of 0.25 MLD capacity.
- One water recycling plant commissioned at Golf Course of 0.25 MLD capacity.
- **Online monitoring of STP and IETP:** Performance of STP and IETP for data pertaining to BOD, COD, pH, TSS and oil content is continuously monitored online 24x7, round the year.

None of sewage, whether treated or untreated, is discharged into Holy River Ganga.

Pollution control:

- Tree Plantation: 3410 nos. up to Jan-23 in 2022-23
- Dry leaf cutting machines: One power operated and one manually operated, portable, compact and user-friendly dry leaf cutting machine has been designed and manufactured in-house by Service Engineering Division. These machines are very useful for converting dry leaf large volume heaps into small volume heaps which can be further used for making organic manure.
- BLW boasts of a green area of 40% of its total area having more than one lakh small & big trees.
- Release of CO2, CO, SO2, NO2 and particulate matters in flue gas through different stacks is regularly monitored and kept within the limit prescribed by Central and State Pollution Control Board.
- Use of pictures for worship of Lord Vishwakarma on "Vishwakarma Pooja" instead of clay idols.
- Waste generated from the residential area is segregated as solid waste and biodegradable waste. Solid waste is dumped at locations nominated by municipality. Biodegradable waste is dumped in the pits for composting. Debris are used to fill the low-lying area.
- 100 kg/hour capacity incinerator is functioning to dispose-off paint sludge, oil-soaked jute, oil saw dust, paint-overall, lube & fuel oil.

6. Certifications

C. ISO 3834-2:2005 Certification


- Over the last 57 years, BLW has established unbeatable "Brand Equity" in respect
 of locomotive sales to Non-Railway Customers (NRCs). This is backed and
 supported by impressive after-sales service and spares-support to all customers.
 This has manifested in repeat orders from the clients. Moreover, BLW also gets
 tough competition from open markets viz BHEL, SAN/Bengaluru etc. for getting
 locomotive supply orders.
- In FY 2022-23, till date, BLW has received purchase order of worth ₹56.34 Cr for six locomotives from NRCs (four nos. from NTPC/Farakka & two nos. from APL/Jharkhand). Further, BLW is expected to get order for five locomotives (four WDS6ADT & one WDG4) from NRCs within India.
- In FY 2022-23, BLW has already dispatched two locomotives worth ₹17.40 Cr to NRCs within India and also exported one locomotive worth ₹15.79 Cr to Mozambique through RITES.
- In FY 2022-23, till date, BLW has received order for spares worth Rs. 9.85 Cr. From NRCs in comparison to spares worth ₹6.35 Cr received in FY 2021-22. This is 55% more than the value of order for spares received in FY 2021-22. This increase in order of spares has become possible due to close liaisoning with customers through Video Conferences.
- In FY 2022-23, till date, BLW has already dispatched spares worth ₹6.08 Cr to NRCs.



11. Training and Skill Development of Employees

A. Training Facilities

Technical Training Centre (TTC) of Banaras Locomotive Works, Varanasi is functional since 1959 to impart training for new recruits, working staff and supervisor, Act

Apprentices and Vocational training to Under Graduate Engineering/ Management students. There is also one more training centre -Indian Railway Welding Research Institute (IRWRI) which functions as 'Apex Body' of Indian Railways for improving welding quality and research.

Facilities in Technical Training Centre:

- Basic Training Workshop: Fitting and Machine shop equipped with conventional and CNC machines.
- Electrical & Electronics lab equipped with cut models and wiring diagrams.
- Computer Lab for computer training
 viz. Computer awareness, advanced computer training, Unicode and AutoCAD training.
- Library: TTC is having library of more than 1000 technical and management books for the knowledge upgradation of trainees and faculty members in various branches i.e. Mechanical, Electrical, Management and Computer Applications.
- Classroom facilities: There are ten classrooms (including six AC rooms) with 25 seats equipped with LCD projectors, computerised interactive boards are available for in-house training.
- Auditorium / Conference Hall: One Air-conditioned Conference Hall & one other Auditorium is available at TTC for seminars & workshop with audio-visual facilities with 150 and 90 seating capacity respectively.

i. Main Activities of Technical Training Centre (TTC):

- In-house and outside Institutional training for BLW supervisors & staff, Probationers and Zonal Railway's supervisors and staff.
- Initial training for newly recruited supervisors, artisans (RRB/promotions / New appointees).
- Training of Act. Apprentices (Non-ITI and ITI) as per "Apprentices Act-1961".
- Degree & Diploma Apprentices training as allotted by Board of Apprenticeship Training (BOAT), Kanpur.
- Vocational training for Under Graduate Engineering Students.
- 'Rail Kaushal Vikas Yojana' (RKVY) training for local youth.
- TTC regularly organizes Seminar/Workshop/Meeting in Auditorium / Seminar Hall.

2. Other Highlights:

- f. In addition to the regular training program conducted by the Technical Training Centre, a total of **714** Under Graduate Engineering students were provided Summer Internship Training this year.
- g. Prepared syllabus for JE (Mechanical and Electrical) as per NSQF guidelines by TTC, BLW, Varanasi.
- h. Under the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme run by the Government of India, BLW received a total of ₹ 1,73,70,487/- (One Crore Seventy-Three Lakhs Seventy Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Seven Rupees) as a part of reimbursement stipend payable to the Apprentices of Government share by the "Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship" claiming from time to time. From September-2022, this amount is being released directly into the bank account of the Apprentices by the Ministry through DBT mode every month.
