

GM inaugurates e-office at DLW

A Mission Mode Project (MMP) has been developed by the National Information Centre (NIC) under the National e-governance Programme of the central government. Under it e-office was inaugurated by General Manager (GM) Rashmi Goel at Diesel Locomotive Works (DLW) on Thursday. Speaking on the occasion, GM said that e-office would prove to be a milestone in the digitization of Indian Railways. "It will ensure increased transparency, accountability, data security and integrity. The e-office system will enable archival and retrieval of data as well as electronic movement and tracking of files. The implementation of e-office will not only bring transparency and efficiency in functioning, but will also promote green working by saving a lot of paper," she said expressing the hope that e-office would be successfully implemented in DLW and all users would be able to reap the benefits. On the occasion Dipu Shyam (GM, RailTel, Lucknow) and senior officers of DLW and RailTel were also present. Its implementation will help more than 1,550 officers and employees in DLW and many of them have been given proper training and the others will get it.

For the implementation of e-office, an MoU has been signed between Indian Railways and RailTel. The RailTel has been issued an order to implement the e-office application across Indian Railways. Various applications
